Additional Items:

1:1 iPad Program – Bring Your Own Device

Truganina South Primary School is promoted as a 21st Century School providing all students with the opportunity to engage with technologies that enhance their learning. **To enhance your child/children's learning, this device should be brought to school, fully charged every day.**

As part of this program, **all families are strongly encouraged to equip their child with an iPad.** These can be either an iPad Mini or full-sized iPad.

The **minimum requirements** are an "iOS 12 compatible" or "iPad 5th Generation" onwards, however, if you are purchasing a new device, we recommend 2022 iPad models such as iPad Pro, iPad Air, iPad or iPad Mini. For storage purposes – minimum storage of 32GB is recommended so that your child can store photos and videos as well as their schoolwork. Curriculum Contributions

Curriculum Contributions are items and activities that students use, or participate in, to access the Curriculum – Paid directly to school via COMPASS (preferred payment)

Payment Options:

Financial Support for Families

Truganina South Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

FAMILY SUPPORT OPTIONS

Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF)

The Victorian Government has again committed to providing eligible students with Camps, Sports & Excursion funds (CSEF). These funds are paid to the school to use towards excursions, incursions and camps for eligible students. To be eligible for the funding, a parent or legal guardian must be the holder of a current Healthcare card or Pension card or be a temporary foster parent on the first day of Term 1 or Term 2. Parents who are eligible for CSEF will be required to complete the CSEF application form attached. Applications close at the end of Term 2, 2023.

Centrepay

Centrepay is a free bill paying service offered by Centrelink to assist eligible Centrelink families to arrange for nominated payment amounts to be deducted at regular intervals. Should you choose this payment method, please contact our school office for further information.

It has always been the policy at Truganina South Primary School that our students should not miss out on opportunities due to financial hardship. No child is denied anything from the basic curriculum.

ONLINE ORDERING INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY as the process may have changed from previous years

DUE DATE: 20 DECEMBER 2022

- Orders must be placed by the due date in order for your child to receive their pack for the first day of Term 1.
- **Orders placed after the due date may NOT be processed until February due to our extremely busy schedule in January. NO EXCEPTIONS**

We apologise if you are a new enrolment or missed the due date due to unavoidable circumstances, but the school is aware your pack won't be ready on the first day of school, so your child should not be disadvantaged.

- Orders placed after the due date will also incur an additional \$5.00 processing fee
- All packs will be delivered to the school and cannot be collected from Paperchase.
- Complete packs only can be ordered through Paperchase. **We do not have a walk-in shop and individual items cannot be purchased. All orders must be placed online.**

Online ordering will close on 5 FEBRUARY 2023.

Online Ordering Procedure

2. Enter this School Access Code: **BTSTSPS**
Access code must be entered. Searching for school will not work
3. Click 'Create Order'
4. Enter students first and last name, choose year level from the drop-down list click '**Continue**'.
5. Click 'Add Order to Cart'
6. You may then either Checkout or Add Another Student.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
